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How to handle donations collected at events:

• Fill out the line on the Pledge Form Carrier (Form 100) earmarked for special event proceeds.

 Download the *Special Events Proceeds Form (Form 150) from cfcnca.org, then complete and obtain signatures from two employees to verify the accuracy of the total funds.

• Insert the signed copy of Form 150 into the Form 100 envelope clipped

to the event funds. Keep a copy for your records.

• Log on to Nexus and complete the line item in the Deposit Bag (Form 300) to report event donations. Also enter this amount on the Total Special Event Proceeds line on the Deposit Bag (Form 300). *https://s3.amazonaws.com/
